- 1/2 Health**

(23 Credits required)

- **Must satisfy state requirements for Safety & Health Ed., Consumer Ed., & Career Ed.**
- **Must carry 6 credits each year. All students must be enrolled in P.E. for four years, unless excused by a doctor.**
- **In order to be a candidate for graduation, a student must be a resident of Unit #40 & enrolled in EHS for the semester immediately preceding graduation, or enter EHS in the semester that would have qualified him/her for graduation at his/her previous school.**
